## 15th International Conference of the ESWTR

August 28 to September 1, 2013 at "Haus der Kirche" in Dresden



The current culture of international relationships is being shaped by globalization and neo-liberalism. These processes - in the form of commercialization - influence all spheres of live (even the most private areas). They come along with violent exclusions that express themselves in sexism, racism or political extremism and become obvious in discrimination against the poor or marginalization.

Such violent potentials of symbolic systems working politically or socially are topic of discourses, whether theological or critical of religion. Postcolonial, post-secular and queer approaches are especially sensitive to mechanisms of subcutaneous violence, including those that are inherent in theological and religious "speech". What is more, these approaches uncover the resistive, "healing" and visionary character of religion just like contextual liberation theologies but they also extend their criticism of ideology by (post-structuralist) criticism of knowledge and science. The conference offers room for all of these approaches. The aim is a realignment and reformulation of critical theology and religious studies and thus feminist-theological research in Germany and Europe.
