ESWTR Conferences aim to support European women involved in academic research in theology and religion, and to facilitate networking and collaborative working. Independent researchers and women employed by academic institutions are equally welcome.

There is a **PhD Student Forum** on Friday evening at 20.30, where students are encouraged to give short papers on their research.

Thursday 20 August is an **Open Day** when students studying at Masters and undergraduate levels are welcome to register and attend plenary and mini-lecture conference sessions.

Conference Languages

- English, German, Spanish.
- Plenary sessions, including the ESWTR General Assembly will be simultaneously translated into the conference languages. Translation in all other sessions will depend on the translation skills of participants in the groups concerned. We ask you to tell us which languages you speak, and at what level, to help us in planning conference groups.

Conference Sessions

- There are four **plenary sessions**, which take the form of **either** a panel of speakers, each giving a short paper, **or** a plenary address followed by four short papers. All plenary sessions finish with comments and questions from conference participants.
- The **ESWTR General Assembly** is a Business Meeting, attended by all members, which is organised by the current ESWTR Board.
- **Rituals**: participants are invited to plan and lead early morning rituals which take place before breakfast each morning. You can show this on your registration form. The conference closes with a ritual, which will be coordinated by members of the organising group.
- In addition we meet in five kinds of small groups during the conference: mini-lectures; subject groups; base groups; country groups & ESWTR business groups. The purpose and format of each kind of group is explained below: -

Mini-Lectures: Call for Papers

Mini-lectures are held in parallel sessions. Proposals are invited for short papers on the conference theme. These lectures should not exceed **20 minutes (2000 words)**. Please submit your proposal on the enclosed form by the registration deadline of **Sunday 31 May 2009**. We will inform you as to whether your proposal has been accepted.

Subject Groups

Subject groups are established around research areas. Subject groups are listed below. Each Subject Group is led by a coordinator, who structures the group session. Conference details on the University of Winchester website will tell you who the coordinator will be. Subject groups provide a space for discussion between researchers with similar interests. If you have a topic you would like to discuss, it is helpful to contact the co-ordinator and/or bring a brief **(5 minute; 500 word)** introduction to open up discussion. This is **not** a forum for giving an academic paper. We hope that subject groups will work across the conference languages, rather than being confined to a single language group. This will depend on participants' willingness to use translation skills. The groups are:

- 1. Religious Texts
- 2. Constructive/Systematic Theology
- 3. Historical Theology
- 4. Philosophy
- 5. Pastoral/Practical Theology
- 6. Religion, Literature & Art

- 7. Ethics
- 8. Ecotheology
- 9. Queer Theology
- 10. Ritual & Liturgy
- 11. Interfaith Dialogue
- 12. Religion & Culture
- Please indicate your first and second choice of Subject Group on the enclosed Registration Form.
- Please, let us know if you want to lead one of the Subject Groups or if you have a different proposal for a subject group that is not listed above.

Base Groups

You will be allocated to a base group, which will include women from different language groups, and will meet each day of the conference. The idea is that this will be a 'home' group, where you can share your experience of the conference in a more personal way. We hope these groups will be supportive, and help us to reach out across cultural divisions. Once more, the success of the groups will depend on willingness of participants to use their language skills to translate into and between the conference languages.

Country Groups

There is an opportunity for all women present to meet with others from their own country. Even if this is the first time you have attended the conference, we encourage you to take part in this session. Any women who are the only people to attend from their country are encouraged to join with another country group of their choice. The Country Group is a forum for preparing contributions to the General Assembly.

ESWTR Business Groups Further preparations for the General Assembly take place in topic-based ESWTR Business Groups, dealing with topics such as: suggesting themes for forthcoming conferences; ESWTR publications. Members of each country group are asked to divide themselves between the various business groups.
