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Introduction

The ESWTR's international conference takes place in the historical city of Dresden, Germany, from 28 August to 1 September 2013. With its topic "New Horizons of Resistance and Visions", the German organizing team would like to connect with the conference in Salamanca 2011, which in the face of deep societal concern and social challenges vividly searched for new feminist, gender sensitive and queer liberation theologies. In our world coined by globalisation and neoliberalism a commodification of the whole life has emerged. In consequence poverty, (hetero-)sexism, homophobia, racism, fundamentalism and nationalism (including rightwing extremism) are producing violent exclusions instead of inclusive ideas of community. What are the answers theological perspectives of different religions can offer to sustainably decrease economic and epistemic violence?

With the chosen context of East Germany, the political and theological power of Eastern European dissidence, which led to the peaceful revolutions of 1989, shall bear fruit in the current search of living together in solidarity in the "one world". Numerous resisting political, religious and arts mobilisations imagined an open and radically democratic society not only beyond real existing socialism but also beyond capitalism. They had their roots in women's, peace- and environmental movements and not least the ecumenical process.

Experiences of resistance and vision shall be brought into conversation with current counter discourses from the globalisation critical and the recent "occupy wallstreet" context. To deepen emancipatory theological perspectives it shall be discussed how existing violence deconstructing intersectional, feminist, gender, queer, postcolonial and post-secular approaches, could be used even better in theologies and critiques of religions.

The particular contribution of theological approaches could be to address and appropriate the dimension of what is transcendent to humanity, the uncontrollable, other wordly yet deeply meaningful involved in the endowment of meaning. Theologians make use of their religious forms, practices, texts and traditions – their talk of God – to achieve this. Especially in intersectional, feminist, gender sensitive, queer, postcolonial and post-secular approaches theologian's struggles and research prove to have a specific sensitivity to manifestations of violence on deep levels of social, global, textual orders, and of course in theological and religious forms of speech.



Formats of the conference

Plenary sessions with 2 speakers (Thu, Fr and Sa 9:00 - 11:00)

In the main panels the speakers will address the topic of the day, each lecture will take about 30 minutes.

Panels, taking place simultaneously (Thu and Sa 11:30 - 13:00)

Each panel will include three 20 min presentations, followed by 10 min of discussion with the audience. The panel presentations should engage in the three main topic clusters: **Postcolonialism, (Post-) Secularism** and **(queer) Visions**. These terms represent the focal perspectives of this conference's title "Resistance and Visions".

Subject groups, also simultaneously (Fr and Sa 17:30 – 18:30)

In each of the subject groups two 20 min presentations are scheduled, followed by 10 min of discussion with the audience. These groups allow space for the approach of the theological disciplines to the overall conference topic.

Parallel groups of young researchers (Fr and Sa 17:30 – 18:30)

There will be two presentations of 20 minutes in each group followed by 10 minutes of discussion. These groups provide a particular space for young researchers.



Rituals (Thu to Sun, morning and/or evening)

The rituals enable participants to pray together and provide space for spirituality, they also make visible the variety of traditions and religions at the conference.

Proposals are invited for papers in panels, subject groups, groups of young researchers, and also for rituals. Please submit your proposal with your registration on the enclosed form. We will consider both new proposals as well as those already submitted after the first Call of Papers. If you wish, you can also specify your older proposal.

Deadline for proposals: 15 April 2013

As we are planning a publication we ask you to mark on the form whether you are interested in the publication of your paper. (Decisions will be made in a peer review process. The deadline for the manuscripts will be 15 October 2013.)
